





- Jer 16:1-5
- (1) The word of the LORD came to me:
- (2) "You shall not take a wife, nor shall you have sons or daughters in this place.
- (3) For thus says the LORD concerning the sons and daughters who are born in this place, and concerning the mothers who bore them and the fathers who fathered them in this land:
- (4) They shall die of deadly diseases. They shall not be lamented, nor shall they be buried. They shall be as dung on the surface of the ground. They shall perish by the sword and by famine, and their dead bodies shall be food for the birds of the air and for the beasts of the earth.
- (5) "For thus says the LORD: Do not enter the house of mourning, or go to lament or grieve for them, for I have taken away my peace from this people, my steadfast love and mercy, declares the LORD.

- Jer 16:6-10
- (6) Both great and small shall die in this land. They shall not be buried, and no one shall lament for them or cut himself or make himself bald for them.
- (7) No one shall break bread for the mourner, to comfort him for the dead, nor shall anyone give him the cup of consolation to drink for his father or his mother.
- (8) You shall not go into the house of feasting to sit with them, to eat and drink.
- (9) For thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: Behold, I will silence in this place, before your eyes and in your days, the voice of mirth and the voice of gladness, the voice of the bridegroom and the voice of the bride.
- (10) "And when you tell this people all these words, and they say to you, 'Why has the LORD pronounced all this great evil against us? What is our iniquity? What is the sin that we have committed against the LORD our God?'

- (11) then you shall say to them: 'Because your fathers have forsaken me, declares the LORD, and have gone after other gods and have served and worshiped them, and have forsaken me and have not kept my law,
  - (12) and because you have done worse than your fathers, for behold, every one of you follows his stubborn, evil will, refusing to listen to me.
- (13) Therefore I will hurl you out of this land into a land that neither you nor your fathers have known, and there you shall serve other gods day and night, for I will show you no favor.'
- (14) "Therefore, behold, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when it shall no longer be said, 'As the LORD lives who brought up the people of Israel out of the land of Egypt.'




- Jer 16:15-18

- (16) "Behold, I am sending for many fishers, declares the LORD, and they shall catch them. And afterward I will send for many hunters, and they shall hunt them from every mountain and every hill, and out of the clefts of the rocks.
- (17) For my eyes are on all their ways. They are not hidden from me, nor is their iniquity concealed from my eyes.
- (18) But first I will doubly repay their iniquity and their sin, <u>because</u> they have polluted my land with the carcasses of their detestable idols, and have filled my inheritance with their abominations."

- (21) "Therefore, behold, I will make them know, this once I will make them know my power and my might, and they shall know that my name is the LORD."



- Jer 17:1-5
- (1) "The sin of Judah is written with a pen of iron; with a point of diamond it is engraved on the tablet of their heart, and on the horns of their altars,
- (2) while their children remember their altars and their Asherim, beside every green tree and on the high hills,
- (3) on the mountains in the open country. Your wealth and all your treasures I will give for spoil as the price of your high places for sin throughout all your territory.
- (4) You shall loosen your hand from your heritage that I gave to you, and I will make you serve your enemies in a land that you do not know, for in my anger a fire is kindled that shall burn forever."

- (15) Behold, they say to me, "Where is the word of the LORD? Let it come!"




- Jer 17:16-20



The Texas attorney general has launched an investigation to determine whether the San Antonio City Council violated religious-liberty laws by barring Chick-fil-A from opening a restaurant in the city's airport.

The council voted late last week to exclude Chick-fil-A from a concession agreement with San Antonio International Airport, citing, in part, the religious views associated with the fast-food restaurant chain — specifically, the anti-same-sex marriage values, according to the Texas Tribune.

The state's attorney general, Ken Paxton, said the treatment of the chain was "discriminatory" and wrote in a letter to San Antonio Mayor Ron Nirenberg and the city council that his office would investigate whether such a ban violates any state laws. He said he also asked the U.S. Department of Transportation to look at the federal regulations.





David Green, CEO of Hobby Lobby, does everything wrong, according to retail conventional wisdom

His stores close at 8 p.m., and don't open at all on Sundays to allow employees to be with their families and attend a house of worship.

Full-time workers start at more than twice the federal minimum wage and have generous benefits.

Hobby Lobby specializes in arts, crafts, hobby, and home decor, yet each outlet carries a vast inventory of 100,000 items.

These are distributed across the country from a central warehouse, rather than using regional depots or having suppliers ship directly to stores, as other retailers do.

There are no bar code scanners at the registers to track inventory.

Yet Green's results have proved the cynical critics dead wrong. The privately held company brings in \$4.3 billion a year from its 750 stores. And according to Forbes, Green's net worth is \$6.4 billion (though he is actively giving away much of it).

"There is nothing negative in the Bible about running a business and it has everything one needs to know about good leadership," Green told IBD from his office in Oklahoma City. "But we're not just trying to make money, we want to do it in a way that puts a high value on caring for our employees and their families. And the opportunity to work reasonable hours helps us attract good managers from other retailers."

Green, 75, grew up in Altus, Okla., a county seat of 20,000 amid ranches and cotton fields. His father was a pastor with just 35 church members, so the family didn't have a car and couldn't



- Jer 19:1-4
- (1) Thus says the LORD, "Go, buy a potter's earthenware flask, and take some of the elders of the people and some of the elders of the priests,
- (2) and go out to the Valley of the Son of Hinnom at the entry of the Potsherd Gate, and proclaim there the words that I tell you.
- (3) You shall say, 'Hear the word of the LORD, O kings of Judah and inhabitants of Jerusalem. Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: Behold, I am bringing such disaster upon this place that the ears of everyone who hears of it will tingle.

### UNG GATE


The unusual name stems from a gate that stood along the city's south wall in the time of Nehemiah (Nehemiah 2:13). The Targum identifies the Dung Gate as the "Potsherd Gate" of Jeremiah 19:2.


In antiquity, the city dump lay in the nearby Hinnom Valley, and the Potsherd Gate served as the exit by which the citizens took out the garbage.




(4) <u>Because</u> the people have forsaken me and have profaned this place by making offerings in it to other gods whom neither they nor their fathers nor the kings of Judah have known; and because they have filled this place with the blood of innocents,











- Jer 19:5-8
- (5) and have built the high places of Baal to burn their sons in the fire as burnt offerings to Baal, which I did not command or decree, nor did it come into my mind--
- (6) therefore, behold, days are coming, declares the LORD, when this place shall no more be called Topheth, or the Valley of the Son of Hinnom, but the Valley of Slaughter.
- (7) And in this place I will make void the plans of Judah and Jerusalem, and will cause their people to fall by the sword before their enemies, and by the hand of those who seek their life. I will give their dead bodies for food to the birds of the air and to the beasts of the earth.
- (8) And I will make this city a horror, a thing to be hissed at. Everyone who passes by it will be horrified and will hiss because of all its wounds.





- Jer 19:9-12
- (9) And I will make them eat the flesh of their sons and their daughters, and everyone shall eat the flesh of his neighbor in the siege and in the distress, with which their enemies and those who seek their life afflict them.'
- (10) "Then you shall break the flask in the sight of the men who go with you,
- (11) and shall say to them, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts: So will I break this people and this city, as one breaks a potter's vessel, so that it can never be mended. Men shall bury in Topheth because there will be no place else to bury.
- (12) Thus will I do to this place, declares the LORD, and to its inhabitants, making this city like Topheth.





Jer 19:13-15

- (13) The houses of Jerusalem and the houses of the kings of Judah--all the houses on whose roofs offerings have been offered to all the host of heaven, and drink offerings have been poured out to other gods--shall be defiled like the place of Topheth."
- (14) Then Jeremiah came from Topheth, where the LORD had sent him to prophesy, and he stood in the court of the LORD's house and said to all the people:
- (15) "Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, behold, I am bringing upon this city and upon all its towns all the disaster that I have pronounced against it, because they have stiffened their neck, refusing to hear my words."




### Jer 20:1-4

- (1) Now Pashhur the priest, the son of Immer, who was chief officer in the house of the LORD, heard Jeremiah prophesying these things.
- (2) Then Pashhur beat Jeremiah the prophet, and put him in the stocks that were in the upper Benjamin Gate of the house of the LORD.
- (3) The next day, when Pashhur released Jeremiah from the stocks, Jeremiah said to him, "The LORD does not call your name Pashhur, but Terror on Every Side.
- (4) For thus says the LORD: Behold, I will make you a terror to yourself and to all your friends. They shall fall by the sword of their enemies while you look on. And I will give all Judah into the hand of the king of Babylon. He shall carry them captive to Babylon, and shall strike them down with the sword.

# Jer 34:6-8

(6) Then Jeremiah the prophet spoke all these words to Zedekiah king of Judah, in Jerusalem, (7) when the army of the king of Babylon was fighting against Jerusalem and against all the cities of Judah that were left, Lachish and Azekah, for these were the only fortified cities of Judah that remained.

called *Hoshaiah Letters*, are a series of letters written in carbon ink in Ancient <u>Hebrew</u> on clay <u>ostraça</u>. The letters were discovered at the excavations at <u>Lachish</u> (Tell ed-Duweir).

The <u>ostraca</u> were discovered by <u>James Leslie Starkey</u> in January–February, 1935 during the third campaign of the <u>Wellcome</u> excavations. They were published in 1938 by Harry Torczyner (name later changed to <u>Naftali Herz Tur-Sinai</u>) and have been much studied since them. Seventeen of them are currently located in the <u>British Museum</u> in London, a smaller number (including Letter 6) are on permanent display at the Rockefeller Museum in Jerusalem, Israel. [2]

### Letter Number 3

Your servant, Hoshayahu, sent to inform my lord, Yaush: May YHWH cause my lord to hear tidings of peace and tidings of good. And now, open the ear of your servant concerning the letter which you sent to your servant last evening because the heart of your servant is ill since your sending it to your servant. And inasmuch as my lord said "Don't you know how to read a letter?" As YHWH lives if anyone has ever tried to read me a letter! And as for every letter that comes to me, if I read it. And furthermore, I will grant it as nothing. And to your servant it has been reported saying: The commander of the army Konyahu son of Elnatan, has gone down to go to Egypt and he sent to commandeer Hodawyahu son of Ahiyahu and his men from here. And as for the letter of Tobiyahu, the servant of the king, which came to Sallum, the son of Yaddua, from the prophet, saying, "Be on quard!" your ser[va]nt is sending it to my lord.[7]



## Jer 20:5-9

- (5) Moreover, I will give all the wealth of the city, all its gains, all its prized belongings, and all the treasures of the kings of Judah into the hand of their enemies, who shall plunder them and seize them and carry them to Babylon.
- (6) And you, Pashhur, and all who dwell in your house, shall go into captivity. To Babylon you shall go, and there you shall die, and there you shall be buried, you and all your friends, to whom you have prophesied falsely."
- (7) O LORD, you have deceived me, and I was deceived; you are stronger than I, and you have prevailed. I have become a laughingstock all the day; everyone mocks me.

- (11) But the LORD is with me as a dread warrior; therefore my persecutors will stumble; they will not overcome me. They will be greatly shamed, for they will not succeed. Their eternal dishonor will never be forgotten.
- (12) O LORD of hosts, who tests the righteous, who sees the heart and the mind, let me see your vengeance upon them, for to you have I committed my cause.
